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About the NSW Finance Doctoral Network

The NSW Finance Doctoral Network is a collaboration among the finance departments of five NSW universities: the University of Sydney, the University of New South Wales, the University of Technology Sydney, Macquarie University, and the University of Wollongong. It grew out of conversations among the universities' PhD coordinators, who saw the value in bringing their doctoral communities together. The Network gives finance PhD students across NSW a shared platform to present their research, receive feedback, build networks with their peers, and connect with potential employers. It is intended as a lasting, annual initiative, with the host rotating among the partner universities.

About the conference

The inaugural NSW Finance Doctoral Conference brings the Network to life for the first time. Over a single day, doctoral students present their research to senior faculty and peers, with experienced academics acting as discussants and mentors. The program features a keynote address, a career pathways panel with speakers from academia, industry, and government, and a session in which recent hires share their experience of the job market. Time is set aside for mentoring and networking throughout the day. The conference is designed above all to support students approaching the job market, and it is free to attend, hosted by Macquarie Business School.

Keynote

Professor Buhui Qiu University of Sydney

Buhui Qiu is Professor of Business and Finance and Head of the School of Finance at the University of Sydney Business School. He holds a PhD in Finance from the University of Cincinnati, and his research spans corporate finance, ESG and climate finance, banking, capital markets, and innovation. His work has appeared in leading journals including the Review of Financial Studies, The Accounting Review, and Management Science, has been cited by policy institutions such as the US Federal Reserve, and has featured in outlets including Bloomberg and The Economist. He has held a number of leadership roles in doctoral education and research at the University of Sydney.

Career pathways panel

Dr Philip Drummond Senior Associate, The Brattle Group

Philip Drummond is a financial economist and Senior Associate at The Brattle Group, where he prepares expert analyses for shareholder class actions, covering causation and loss, market efficiency, valuation, and price inflation. He holds a PhD in Finance from the Australian National University and was previously a Lecturer at Monash University.

Dr Ashley Ding Senior Analyst, System Design, Australian Energy Market Operator

Ashley Ding is a Senior Analyst at the Australian Energy Market Operator (AEMO). She previously worked in energy modelling at the Australian Government Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water, covering electricity and gas markets, emissions projections, and electric vehicle infrastructure.
